



Months	Topics/Chapters to be covered
Jan 2026	Why study economic history, problems in interpreting India's past, the state of the Indian economy on the eve of independence, Indian economy in the mid nineteenth century, growth of the empire & systems of land settlements in the Colonial India.
Feb 2026	Transformation of the traditional village - economy during the British rule, commercialization of agriculture - its causes & consequences, emergence of agricultural labour as a category, movement of agricultural wages & prices during the period - problems of rural indebtedness.
